







































The Seedlings Project of Skeleton Sea "Turns Trash into Art!

The Key Actions:

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In October 2015, November 2015 and April 2016 we hosted in 21 days:

- 41 Beach Clean-ups sessions with marine and coastal water education in combination with
- 41 Skeleton Sea "Seedlings- Turn Trash into Art" workshops directly at the Foz do Lizandro and Ribeira D'Ilhas Beach of Ericeira.
- Final exhibition of "Turn Trash into Art" artworks created in each
 workshop by the school-children together with artworks from Skeleton
 Sea artist in the last 2 weeks of April 2016 in the Sala Atlântico of Park
 Santa Marta in Ericeira:

Result 1: 863 Nº of visitors counted between 17 a 30 Abril 2016

Result 2: 900 art works on exhibition

 Before working with the children directly we organized 3 sessions of Certified Teacher Training mid of October 2015 – developed by collaborating Marine Biologist.
